REVITALISATION OF CHRIST CHURCH ARCADIA YOUTH

2011 is proving to be a blessed year for Christ Church Arcadia. With the appointment of Father Duncan Mbonyana, the church has been steadily welcoming new members through its doors and this includes a young contingent. So excitement was sparked when talks of a dedicated youth guild began and one eventually came to fruition: the Christ Church Arcadia Youth (CCAY) was officially launched on the 26 March 2011 and formed part of the Tshwane Bokone Archdeaconry's youth. Lindani Dube and Lesego Khoza were elected as the CCAY Chairman and Deputy Chairman respectively. Saturdays were selected for the youth's meetings during which their schedule was discussed and filled with fund raisers, Bible studies and events with other parishes.

The first such event was a youth conference hosted by the CCAY on 21 May 2011. Activities, debates and interactive talks took place covering matters that ranged from Satanism in schools, to the model family and Religion vs. Culture, all topics relevant to the youth of today. The conference was a smashing success as it was well attended by all the archdeaconry's parishes and also served to place the newly formed guild on the map. The CCAY also attended a choir competition held at the St Albans Cathedral, which it could not participate in, but was present to cheer Tshwane Bokone's youth choir to victory.

After these events the youth guild was eager to be in the presence of like-minded people and was more than happy to attend the Youth Day sports event on 16 June 2011 at the Pretoria Rugby Club for the archdeaconry youth. It was a day of fun in the sun where alliances between parishes were made and young people proved that youth is in fact not wasted on the young on the sports fields. At the close of the day scores were tallied and the team Christ Church Arcadia had formed with St Timothy came in second place for soccer and first place for netball, not shabby for a three-month-old group!

With this new-found confidence the CCAY guild is looking to make a difference in Arcadia by getting involved in community projects and charity work and if their young spirits are not enough, they are sure the friends they have made across Tshwane North will be available. This youth is looking forward to a long future, bejewelled by the growth of young people in Jesus Christ.


